



## **2020 Stormwater Marker Project Summary**

**Project Goal:** Kalamazoo County and the City of Kalamazoo continuation of a 2008 educational project to increase public awareness to protect our natural stormwater resources by placing educational markers on public storm drains within the City of Kalamazoo.

**Project Description:** The stormwater marker project uses metal markers with messaging like "No Dumping, Drains to Creek," and places them using adhesive to stormwater inlets and catch basins along the curb. Since the stormwater sewer system discharges to local surface water, the goal of the project is to bring community awareness to the stormwater municipal drainage system in an effort to stop preventable pollutants from getting into local surface water. The Kalamazoo municipal stormwater sewer system covers the entire city and 70% discharges to the Portage Creek/Arcadia Creek watershed. The majority of pollutants that get into our lakes, streams, rivers and wetlands come from stormwater runoff. Protecting the stormwater sewers from avoidable dumping is the primary focus of the project. "What gets in the street, gets to the creek!"
